The Hong Kong Institute for Monetary and Financial Research (HKIMR) is organizing The 14th Annual International Conference on the Chinese Economy titled **“China and the Global Trade Landscape: Challenges and Opportunities”** in Hong Kong on **14 October 2024**.

China plays a key role in global trade. Domestically, China is making efforts to transition to a more diverse economic structure driven by technology, innovation and consumption. The geo-economic fragmentation is also leading to the realignment of the global supply chain. All these may impact China’s trade pattern and the future trends of globalization. This year’s conference will focus on trade-related topics. We invite submissions on topics that include (but are not limited to):

- Supply chain realignment and China international trade
- China’s digital economy, e-commerce and international trade
- Currency invoicing, settlement of China’s international trade
- China’s international trade on service
- Global commodity trade and China demand
- Property right, patent and China’s international trade
- China’s high-tech trade
- Belt and Road Initiative and China’s international trade
- Multinationals and China’s international trade
- China’s international trade, FDI and ODI

We invite authors to submit completed papers or extended abstracts. The deadline for submissions is 31 July 2024. Authors of accepted papers will be informed by 16 August 2024.

All submissions should be sent by email to hkimr@hkma.gov.hk in PDF format, using the authors’ names as the file name, and enter "Submission for HKIMR 14th Annual International Conference on Chinese Economy 2024" as the email subject line.

The papers will be selected based on originality, analytical rigor, and policy relevance. Preference will be given to completed papers.

The conference will take place in person. Financial support for travel and accommodation costs might be available for presenters and discussants from academia.
